Kung Family Story

After driving almost 100 kilometers from their home in Queensland, Australia, to have a cyst checked on their child's leg, Doungnead and Anthony found comfort from RMHC as they processed the news they received. "The doctors told us that the cyst was actually a sarcoma and the best way to manage it was amputation prior to her undergoing chemotherapy," recalls Doungnead.

Over the course of the next week, 11-yearold Anunta was booked for further scans, leaving Doungnead and Anthony unsure where they could stay during Anunta's daily hospital visits.

When they needed it most, their local RMHC Chapter was there for all of them,

providing a place to stay, eat and cope. They stayed at a Ronald McDonald House near Anunta's hospital, ensuring that the whole family could easily travel to the hospital for her appointments, and were able to focus all of their attention on Anunta's treatment.

"Being in a place where everyone cares about you, and is there for you, was so special. It became our second home," Doungnead said. "It also took away a lot of stress and anxiety with regards to finances," Anthony shared. "Before we were given the room at the House, I was looking at how we could afford to stay near the hospital — rentals, hotels, they were all so expensive, and we wouldn't have been able to do it."

Staying with RMHC also meant that when Anthony returned to work, he could do so knowing Anunta and Doungnead were looked after — and only minutes away from the hospital.

"Having this place and the network of people who could look after Anunta and Doungnead while I was working, and all at no cost, was a massive relief for us all. We're just so thankful, so grateful," said Anthony.

Thanks to people like you, RMHC is able to be there for families like Anunta's — ensuring they are fully supported — throughout their child's medical journey.

In Memoriam

Dr. Audrey Evans (1925 – 2022)

When a child is seriously ill or injured, the only thing a family should have to worry about is getting them the care they need. Each year, millions of families are faced with uncertainty when they have to travel for the medical care their child needs. Where will they stay? How will they pay for it? Thankfully, they are able to turn to Ronald McDonald House Charities for support — thanks to Dr. Audrey Evans.

Although she recently peacefully passed away, we celebrate the life of the extraordinary woman who changed the world through her life's work. She insightfully knew that "a family with a sick child is a sick family," and built a care model around this strongly held belief. This philosophy is what lead her to creating a place for parents to stay close to the hospital while their seriously ill children were being treated. She knew that families needed to stay together during the most difficult times of their lives.

Dr. Evans changed the course of pediatric medical treatment worldwide with the creation of the first Ronald McDonald House[®] in Philadelphia in 1974 which served as a model for 380 other House programs across the globe. Services have also expanded, including 690+ RMHC-affiliated programs in more than 60 countries and regions, providing family-centered care and resources to millions of families with ill or injured children each year.

Dr. Audrey Evans has left a lasting legacy of helping children when they need it most throughout the world and we are forever grateful for the incredible impact she has and will continue to have on millions of children and their families. Our Impact in 2022






